

## The Freemasons Without Borders Lodge of MMM's No 2031

On the 30th October the Consecration took place of a new Mark Lodge under the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons The Freemasons Without Borders Lodge of MMM's No 2031.

There are 4 founders from Warwickshire Mark—W Bro Andrew Armbrister, W Bro Paul Rowlands, W Bro Roger Millwater and W Bro Michael Squires.

A fantastic day, and not one that takes place often (Although please remember that the Consecration of the Provincial Wardens Lodge is happening on Saturday 26th February at Rugby!).

The Consecration was carried out superbly by the MW Pro Grand Master, M.Wor.Bro.Raymond Smith. The Installation of the Primus Worshipful Master, R.W.Bro. Ryan Willams Grand Secretary was performed by the R.W.Asstisstant Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Stephen Davison and the Address to the Worshipful Master was given by the R.W.Deputy Grand Master all under the careful guidance of the Grand D.C. R.W.Bro. Frank Spencer.

While there are several Lodges that meet at locations determined by the Worshipful Master this Lodge is slightly unusual (and probably unique) in that it must meet in the Province of the Worshipful Master and the Installation must be at Mark Masons Hall on the Saturday immediately preceding the June Investiture Meeting of Mark Grand Lodge. The Lodge's other two Meetings are on the 1st 5th Saturday of the month in the year and the 5th Saturday occurring in the three months September, October or November.

And to top it all over £3000 raised for the MBF.

This is not the Lodge with the highest number so far—Constantin Moroiu No. 2032 and Sanctuarum No 2033, both in the Inspectorate of Romania are higher but were Consecrated before this Lodge.

And looking at it the other way round there are these Lodges that have lower numbers but more recent Consecrations:-

- Southern Star Lodge No 2026 in the Province of Essex
- West Yorkshire Mark Provincial Grand Stewards Lodge No 2018
- Hippolyto Joseph da Costa Lodge No 2029 in the District of Brazil
- Sierra Gaucha Lodge No. 2030 in the District of Brazil (Both these last two with Royal Ark Mariner Lodges attached)

It would appear that we are not only the 'Friendly Degree' but that we are getting new friends as well!








# **Just for Fun!**
